WELCOME TO MONTPELLIER

Located near the Mediterranean Sea, Montpellier lies in the Occitanie region and in the historical land of Languedoc, positioned on a key communication route between Spain to the west and Italy to the east. The city enjoys a Mediterranean climate and is a thriving urban center with a population of nearly 300,000. Since 1962, Montpellier has experienced significant population growth, and its residents are known as «Montpelliérains» and «Montpelliéraines».



Montpellier is the seventh-largest city in France by population and the third-largest on the Mediterranean coast, after Marseille and Nice. Remarkably, it is one of the few cities with over 100,000 residents to have experienced continuous population growth every year since 1945. This steady expansion makes Montpellier the largest city in the Hérault department and the second-largest in the Occitanie region, after Toulouse.

FACULTY OF ECONOMICS

The Faculty of Economics at the University of Montpellier is a leading institution in France, situated on the Richter campus. It offers a comprehensive range of programs, including Bachelor's degrees, 13 Master's courses, 10 Diplomas of University Studies (DUs), and doctoral programs, with options for continuing education. With a student body of approximately 1 900, the faculty is supported by 42 teacher-researchers and 16 administrative staff. Internationally, it maintains a robust network of over 60 partner universities across five continents, facilitating student mobility through exchange agreements and double degree programs.

The faculty is actively involved in various international cooperation initiatives, including Erasmus+, BCI, and inter-university agreements, offering students opportunities to study abroad in Europe, North America, Latin America, and Africa. Additionally, it collaborates with institutions such as the Franco-Chinese Institute of Renmin University of China. The Faculty of Economics is committed to fostering global academic partnerships and enhancing the international experience of its students.
